Our villagers have an opportunity to work as performative artists, but also as teachers for children, as well as serving tables, tending bar, working as theater grip, gardener, public relations, street sweeper and much more.

It takes practice, to inhabit such a village, it's not to be taken for granted. We give great importance to the creation and cure of every summer's unique group. This is the basis — social, working and community basis — of all of our activities.

WHY BE A VILLAGER?

We believe that our practices here at la Luna serve us to live more consciously also outside this village.

We are living in troubled times, all of us, and we are convinced that it is through this action — dedicating ourselves with our full energies to something as apparently frivolous as a theater festival— that we can find the way to a healthier life. We want to take care, not just of the artists and the audience we will meet, but also of ourselves.

As always, it is a delicate balance: besides a lot of will, effort and sweat which we request of our villagers to co-create this festival, we take the opportunity to gather equally joy, surprise and confirmation of our fundamental humanity... in the end, ours is an action which will support peace in the world.



How to become a villager

Participation is free (excluding a small contribution to cover insurance), and yet very costly: We offer room and board (camping), and an intense, practical theatrical education, as well as a model for living and working together in a creative group.

You offer your dedication, your physical and mental energy, and your goodwill for a month of very special work here at la Luna.


